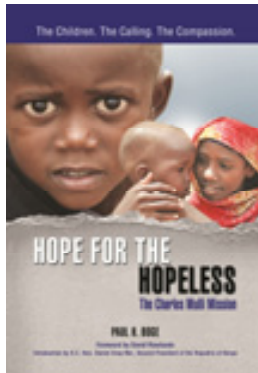

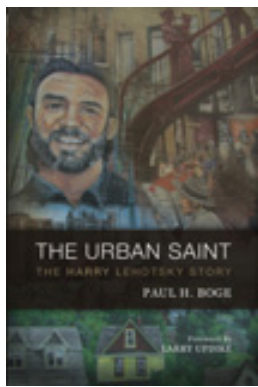


### **Hope For The Hopeless: The Charles Mulli Mission**

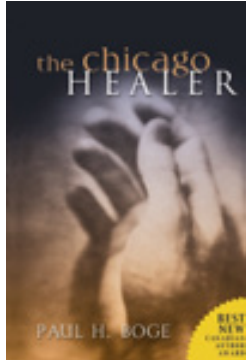


### **THE URBAN SAINT: THE HARRY LEHOTSKY STORY**

Paul has written 5 books including three biographies – *Father to the Fatherless: The Charles Mulli Story*, *Hope for the Hopeless: The Charles Mulli Mission*, *The Urban Saint: The Harry Lehotsky Story*, and two novels *The Chicago Healer* and *The Cities of Fortune*. Paul has also written, directed and produced two films – *Among Thieves* (feature) and *Espresso Junction* (short). Paul attended Maple Leaf School, Mennonite Brethren Collegiate Institute, (MBCI), the University of Manitoba, Hinterholz Capernwray in Switzerland, and completed the screenwriting program at the University of California at Los Angeles (UCLA). Passionate about Africa and causes for the poor both at home and abroad, Paul is privileged to serve on various charities that exemplify the love of Christ. He has been actively involved in Mully Children’s Family – a ministry that rescues street children from the slums of Kenya, as well as Russia Reconnect, Family Life Network and also Union Gospel Mission in Winnipeg. Paul is currently developing a feature film about Mully Children’s Family Founder Charles Mulli which is planned to be shot in Kenya. He loves the LORD and is actively involved in various organizations including the annual Winnipeg Real to Reel Film Festival based out of his home church of North Kildonan Mennonite Brethren. Paul also loves to preach, play guitar in a rock and roll band, run, surf, cheer on the Winnipeg Jets, and to spend time with his nieces and nephews – especially hunting for buried treasure on Lake Winnipeg.

## **PAUL'S CURRENT PROJECTS**

### **Father to the Fatherless – The Motion Picture**

This will be a narrative feature length film (i.e. not a documentary) on the life of Charles Mulli based on the true story Father to the Fatherless: The Charles Mulli Story. Paul has completed the screenplay and the business plan. Paul is currently sourcing funding and securing the lead actor to play Charles Mulli. Release date not yet set.

### **The Biggest Family In The World**

Paul is working together with Winnipeg illustrator Faye Hall to create a children's book of the life of Charles Mulli. This will feature approximately 32 paintings with narrative description to make the life of Charles Mulli real to those six years and older. Release date is 2014.

### **Mulli Youth Story (No title yet)**

This will be a biographical novel featuring the life of one of the girls who has been rescued by Mully Children's Family (MCF). The story will see life from her perspective from her beginning as an orphan without hope, to being rescued by Charles Mulli, her life and experiences at Mully Children's Family, and her successful life after MCF. Paul has completed the research stage and is currently working on the outline. Release date is expected to be 2013 or 2014.
